


1. Background

1.1 Status

Municipal solid waste management constitutes one of the most crucial health and environmental problems facing governments of African cities:

- 20 80 % of the waste generated in the urban settings is collected
- 40 90 % of the SW is organic = threat to Environment & Human Health
- SW collected are poorly disposed and treated : very few Africa cities have sanitary landfills
- 20-50 percent of their budget in solid waste management



Human & Environment Health are negatively impacted and subsequently the Regional economic Growth



1.2 Main Constraining Factors

1. Rapid Urban growth : - Urban pop. growth is the highest in the word – 3.3 % per year


2 AfDB'S Response

- Five Goals "High 5's"-, (2015) to scale up and accelerate the delivery and developmental impacts of the Bank's Ten Year Strategy




2.2 The High 5 : an opportunity to promote Sanitation & Environment Health in African Cities



More than hygiene and human dignity factors, SWM a potential contributor to 4 out of the 5 AfDB priorities to accelerate the development of Africa






AfDB's Engagement in Water & Sanitation Sector

AHWS leads Bank's work on **promotion of sustainable and integrated solutions across the water and sanitation value chain** to support Africa's economic transformation



2.4 Increasing Financing trends



Significant Sanitation Focus: In 2017, over 60% of the financing was for sanitation including SWM component



2.5 Few W&S operations with SWM component

Ouagadougou Project : Improving Sanitation in the Periurban Ouagadougou

- Category:Project Preparation + Investment promotion (Phase I : => 2013)Downsrteam Investment [Phase II: 2014 to date]
- **Scope** Integrated urban sanitation project = Drainage, SWM, FSM, WWM
- Phase I (a) Studies : Feasability, Detail design, Tender Documents + (b) Donor round table
- Phase II Investment/ AfDB contribution = 38 M USD out of which 10 M USD for SWM
 - (i) Upgrading (28 TS) and construction (15 TS) and equipment (Containeur)
 - (ii) Expansion of the sanitary lanfill with 22 new cells :
 - (iii) Expansion of the capacity of recycling
 - (iv) 1300 new permanent Jobs

GRANT: 12 M USD for the SWM component






